Think tank focus

Motivation represents a fundamental component of success and well-being in any area of life – driving action, enhancing performance, promoting learning and development, and contributing to overall satisfaction and resilience. This 2024 ECML-EC think tank will focus on the particular significance of motivation in relation to the world of language education.

According to the 2023 edition of the Eurydice report for the European Union, there has been a decrease in the percentage of students in lower secondary education learning two or more foreign languages since 2013. Moreover, the findings are even less auspicious in the context of secondary vocational education. This is in stark contrast to the situation regarding the learning of English; more and more education systems are introducing English at an earlier age and currently almost all students in lower secondary are learning English.

When these findings are placed in the wider political context of the Council of Europe's 2022 Recommendation on the importance of plurilingual and intercultural education for democratic culture and the Council of the European Union's 2019 Recommendation on a comprehensive approach to the teaching and learning of languages, both of which stress the added-value of learning more than one language, it is important to understand the role of both learner and teacher motivation as being in constant flux and in interaction with a wide range of internal and external influencing factors and to identify these factors — be they attitudinal, structural, pedagogical or political.

The think tank will not only attempt to identify the challenges for education systems in promoting the learning of languages other than/in addition to English but will give careful consideration to how these might be overcome.

Promoting Excellence in Language Education Pour l'excellence dans l'éducation aux langues Für Sprachenbildung auf höchstem Niveau The one-day event will involve a combination of keynote speeches, short presentations, group work and a panel discussion.

Objectives of the think tank

- strengthen awareness of the importance of addressing motivational issues related to the learning of languages other than/in addition to English;
- take stock of research trends on motivation and highlight examples of interesting educational practice which are potentially transferable/adaptable to other counties and contexts;
- identify key factors influencing motivation;
- publish inspiring examples and the Motivation Manifesto on the forthcoming dedicated website: www.ecml.at/motivation;
- consider the potential for further action at a European level in this area.
